



#### BLOCK LOTTERY FOR THE December 12th MEETING!

Pat Sloan's Solstice block for December is block #19. We have asked EVERYONE to make one of these blocks to donate to the Quilts for Veterans. This is a big block—the equivalent of 4 blocks. 6 of these can be used to make a lap quilt. We have seen some really great pictures of this block. And if you don't want to be bothered with those stair steps up each side, please look at page 4 of the instructions, Pat gives the size to cut for a solid piece on each side.

Pat Sloan's Solstice Block for January is block #20—Hugs and Kisses

Make this block with a white background, and make your X's and O's in any combination of scrappy colors.

You could do X's in black and O's in a variety of pinks and reds as shown in Pat's picture. Or you could use any combination of colors. Let yourself go! You can go scrappy on the 2 inch squares as well. Anything goes. The picture on the left shows several combinations I am going to make.

SOS Village Work Days


Please note there will be no SOS sewing in December.
