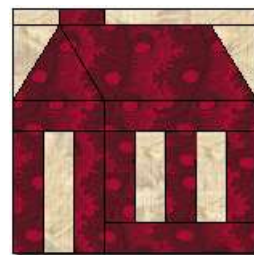

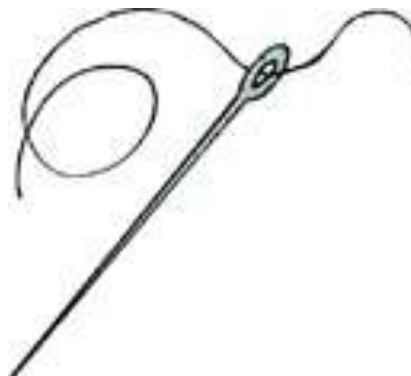
FALL RETREAT -- October 15- 18, 2015 at "The Well " in LaGrange, IL
